



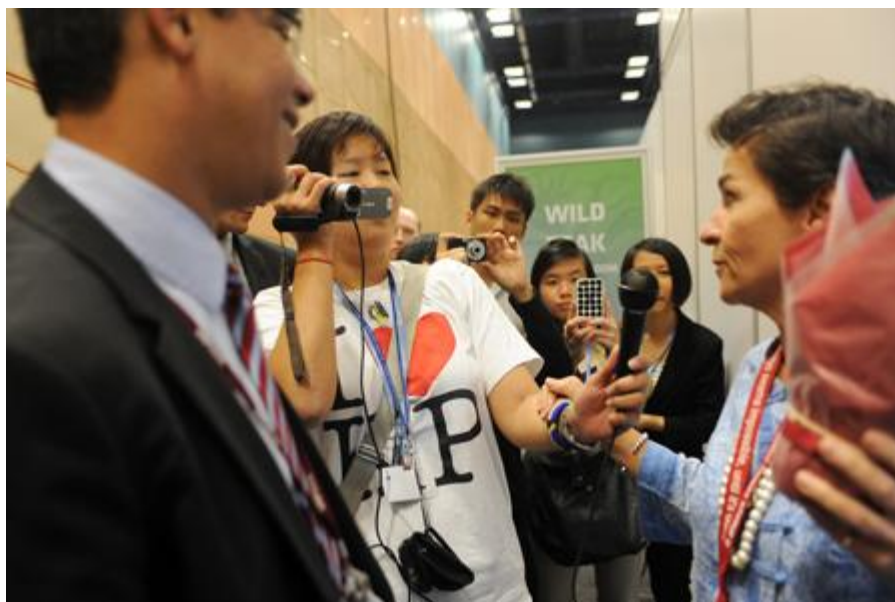

FEEDBACK ON THE COP 17/CMP7 NEGOTIATIONS 9 DECEMBER 2011

SESSIONS HELD ON 8 DECEMBER 2011

HIGH LEVEL SEGMENT

Parties through their ministers continued to make statements to a joint high-level segment.



INFORMAL STOCKTAKING

The various chairs gave feedback on progress and the COP President stated that she had appointed various ministers to lead the discussions on key issues as follows:

- Botswana for shared vision

- New Zealand for developed and developing country mitigation
- Ecuador for the Adaptation Committee
- Venezuela for response measures
- France on sectoral approaches
- UK for Review

Other issues to note in the feedback from SBSTA was that progress had been made on CCS in the CDM and response measures. The Chair of the AWG-KP reported back that work was continuing on finding a consensus on a second commitment period.

Indaba

The Indaba process continues in order to try and resolve some of the issues. New text was put onto the UNFCCC website late last night outlining various options for negotiation.

CDM

CDM negotiations continued and the final text last night has many brackets still remaining. It was agreed the the CDM Executive Board will conduct a CDM policy dialogue.

In general the Ministers will continue to meet today to begin discussing the issues forwarded to them.
